If I am elected I will be pleased to call for EHDC to reaffirm its commitment to its Climate Change Motion, review progress and strengthen its policies. The council should certainly consult local residents more and ensure that the development has the lowest possible impact on the environment both in terms of its carbon footprint and the waste and pollution created.

Regarding management of parks and green spaces, I consider 'No mow May'' to be excellent idea as are green corridors and I would be pleased to support their implementation throughout the district.

I am a member of The Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust and also regularly contribute to Greenpeace.

As a teenager I was strongly influenced by Rachel Carson's seminal work 'Silent Spring'. Since then I have been committed to reducing, and where possible phasing out, pesticide use.
